Drivers in the UK are very angry at the moment! This is because they are soon going to have to pay more to use the roads.

In the UK, as in many countries, there are more cars on the roads every day and this is causing problems. People want to live in the country and travel to work in the towns and cities but the result is busier roads and more traffic jams.
