



The letter w joins by taking the pen across to the next letter (not down to the line).








To show the different sounds, the oo (as in foot) and oo (as in moon) are shown by thin and fat letters.






In writing an ordinary oo is used.

Further Guidance

Pages 2-11. Sounds.

All the sounds in the Jolly Phonics Workbooks are introduced with a storyline that can be elaborated on. For a child who finds it difficult to learn the sounds, making more use of the actions will be helpful.

Pencil Hold.

Ensure the child has the 'tripod' grip between the thumb and first two fingers.



Pages 20, 22. Alternative digraphs in spelling.

The alternative spellings ai, a-e and ay (in rain, make, hay) are normally read as the same sound. However in writing the right one must be chosen for the spelling to be correct. This spelling has to be learned for each word.

Page 16. Alternative sounds in reading.

The spellings on this page can have the sound oo in wood, or oo in moon. A simple rule in reading is "If one way doesn't work, try the other".

Page 19. Tricky Words.

Mnemonics can be useful as an alternative to the Look, Cover, Write, Check method of spelling these irregular words. Another mnemonic is 'Big Elephants Are Ugly' for the tricky beginning of words like beauty and beautiful.

All the letter sounds of English are introduced (not just the alphabet), with an 'action' for each. Exercises show how to use the letter sounds to read and to spell, along with ways of learning the 'tricky' spellings. The correct way to form each letter is shown and in later Workbooks joined-up (cursive) writing is introduced.
