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Introduction

The IELTS General Training Writing test lasts 60 minutes and consists of two tasks – Task 1 and Task 2. Let's look at **Task 2** in more detail.

What is the format of General Training Writing Task 2?

Task 2 requires you to write **at least 250 words** about a point of view, an argument or a problem. You will be asked to present factual information, outline a problem and present a solution, present and justify an opinion, evaluate and challenge ideas, evidence or arguments. You also need to show you can write in an appropriate style.

Task 2 carries twice as many marks as Task 1, so you should spend **about 40 minutes** on this task.

How is IELTS General Training Writing Task 2 assessed?
