

Choosing a pizza can be tough. There are just so many combinations of ingredients. The "Subconscious Menu" at this pizza restaurant tries to solve the problem. The menu is on a tablet and shows a customer 20 different pizza ingredients. In just 2.5 seconds it presents, from 4,896 combinations, your perfect pizza. The menu works by using the camera on the tablet. It follows your eyes and decides which ingredients you look at the longest. The "Subconscious Menu" claims to choose the correct pizza 98% of the time!

Like the pizza menu, Pepper the robot uses cameras to read your emotions. It can understand a range of expressions, from smiling to nodding your head, and react to what it sees. Pepper can offer to have a chat when you are stressed, or do a funny dance when you are feeling miserable! Pepper shows its own emotions, too: it's pleased to see you in the morning, and it feels confused when it doesn't understand people. The realistic robot even looks like it's breathing! And Pepper's helpful: it accesses the Internet to find information, like weather forecasts, and suggests taking an umbrella when it's rainy!

The robots are so popular that the company sold the first 1,000 (at \$1,800 each) in just one minute!





Robots like Pepper can understand some human emotions. But imagine a computer that knows exactly how you are feeling, just by looking at your face.

Affectiva, a U.S. company, has developed software that analyzes facial expressions of emotion. The company has analyzed over 4.7 million faces from 75 different countries.

Affectiva believes there are thousands of uses for the software in our daily lives. For example, it wants to use the software in cars to know when drivers are tired, and in learning apps to know when students are bored or confused.




